### **Objective(s) for the Committee Call**

- Advance notice of intent (NOI) to prepare an environmental impact statement (EIS) for the disposal of greater-than-class C low-level radioactive waste.
- Integrated Waste Treatment Unit (IWTU) decontamination and dismantlement (D&D) future/reuse of facility.

Brian Edgerton said the NOI scheduled for around the first week of July. Once issued, there will be several public hearings at the potential sites. Potentially, August 9<sup>th</sup> DOE will have a public scoping hearing in Idaho. This is all part of the pre-NEPA process. This will be a DOE-complex issued EIS. There is no specific location identified at this time and RWMC staff is only providing programmatic support since they are familiar with this type of waste.

Keith Lockie noted that during the last meeting a CAB member asked how DOE considers D&D aspects or potential future use as a new facility is being designed and built. DOE Orders require that this be addressed when designing a new facility. At this time, there is no plan for further use of the IWTU after the sodium-bearing waste is treated (other than a small amount of waste similar to what was in the tank farm) and it is not known to be made available to any offsite interests. The contract with CWI includes preparing part of the building to be easily adaptable to accommodate loading calcine containers on a truck for final disposal. Additionally, stainless steel walls will be used for easier decontamination and shielding walls will be 32-in. thick concrete (able to accommodate dose levels of calcine). At this time, the contractor has prepared the ground for pouring a foundation. Premier Technologies in Blackfoot are producing the skids, etc. that will be used inside the IWTU. It may be interesting for the CAB to tour this facility later this summer to see the progress and size of this equipment.
